Increased inspections are based on a countries and/or establishments compliance history. Import inspection personnel must access and print a copy of the Increased Foreign Country/Plant list (Outlook Public Folders / All Public Folders I OIA / IID / Import Folder) daily as part of the Contingency Plan. The guidelines associated with the "Foreign Country/Establishments on increased inspection" must be followed as part of the contingency plan instead of the stated rates of inspection in the table above.

A **Pink Juice Test** must be performed on all Cooked Beef Products from Argentina and Brazil. Product from Uruguay that is not certified properly will also need a Pink Juice Test performed.

Eligibility of a country or establishment exporting to the US is subject to change daily. Import inspection personnel must verify that all products presented for reinspection during contingency is eligible. Any shipments that are **questionable** should be held until the IFO or headquarters office can be contacted. For a current list of eligible countries and establishments go to:

APHIS Disease - Imported meat, poultry and egg products must originate in countries eligible to export to the U.S. and establishments certified by the foreign government as eligible. Once eligibility is established, the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service animal health restrictions determine the specific types of products that can be imported from the country.
