Previously, on October 02, 2007, FSIS filed a complaint to withdraw inspection service based on violations of FSIS public health requirements and repetitive violations of Agency statutory and regulatory requirements.

On March 12, 2008, Mr. Islambouli pled guilty to 1 count information, holding for sale adulterated meat in violation of 21 U.S.C. Section 610 (d), 678 (a) and 18 U.S.C Section 2.
JACK MCCLANAHAN OMAHA, NE	10/17/07		12/18/07	03/19/08	On March 19, 2008, the United States District Court for the District of Nebraska, sentenced Mr. Jack McClanahan for 1 Lacey Act violation and 2 Federal Meat Inspection Act violations. Mr. McClanahan was ordered to pay \$10,000 and was placed on probation for 3 years. The sentencing included provisions that prohibit him from selling meat or animals, engaging in any business that has to do with processing or sale of meat or animals, and processing any type of meat for other than his personal use. This action was the result of a joint investigation by the Nebraska Fish and Wildlife Service and the Food Safety and Inspection Service, Compliance and Investigation Division.
