

FILING AN EEO COMPLAINT

Initiating Contact with an Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) Counselor

Discrimination is unlawful. Individuals who believe they have been subjected to discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, age, mental or physical disability, protected genetic information, marital or familial status, political beliefs, or reprisal for prior EEO activity, MUST initiate contact with an EEO Counselor prior to filing a formal EEO complaint in order to attempt to resolve the matter informally.

Who Can Initiate Contact with an EEO Counselor? Any employee, former employee, or applicant for employment with the Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) may initiate contact with an EEO Counselor to make claim of employment discrimination.

Timeframe for Initiating an Informal EEO Complaint: It is the responsibility of the aggrieved person to seek EEO counseling in a timely manner. An aggrieved person **MUST initiate contact with an EEO Counselor within 45 calendar days** of the date of the alleged discriminatory matter, or in the case of a personnel action, within 45 calendar days of the effective date of the action. An aggrieved person has the option to pursue informal resolution through Alternative Dispute Resolution or Traditional Counseling. These options are discussed during the initial counseling session.
