INSTRUCTIONS FOR FSIS FORM 9080-3

Purpose:

For most countries, all FSIS-authorized meat, poultry and egg product establishments are eligible to export meat, poultry and egg products, provided all requirements indicated in the Library of Export Requirements are met. Several countries, however, require additional certification provided by the establishment and approved by FSIS. The country requirements listed in the Library of Export Requirements will reflect the necessity of this additional certification process if required.

Instructions:

Complete FSIS Form 9080-3 in its entirety. All fields must be completed in order to process the request. Submit the form to the FSIS inspection official assigned to the establishment, who will review and verify that the establishment meets the requirements of the importing country.

The FSIS inspection official will sign the form and forward it, through the appropriate FSIS District Office. The District Office will approve, sign and send this form to the FSIS Office of International Affairs via FAX (202) 720-7990, or email to ImportExport@fsis.usda.gov, or mail to Office of the International Affairs, 1400 Independence Ave SW, Room 2137-South Building, Washington, DC 20250.

Approval:

FSIS/OIA will notify the importing country of the certification. Once the establishment is certified by the foreign country, the appropriate FSIS Eligible Plant List for the importing country will be updated indicating that certification has been accepted by the country.
