Dear Ms. Thompson:

This is the first interim response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request to the Department of Agriculture (USDA), Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS), dated October 10, 2018, in which you requested a copy A copy of Good Commercial Practices documents related to poultry slaughter, from May 18, 2018 to September 30, 2018. FSIS received your request on October 10, 2018.

The FSIS FOIA staff works with subject matter experts across the Agency to locate responsive documents. For this request, we conducted a records search in the Office of Planning, Analysis and Risk Management. FSIS' search began on October 11, 2018 and includes responsive records in our control on that date.

For this release, we have processed 175 pages that are responsive to your request. After a thorough review, we have determined that portions of the records are exempt from disclosure under (b)(4) and (b)(6) of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552, as amended. Accordingly, this request is granted in part.

Portions of the responsive records are exempt from disclosure under FOIA Exemption 4 U.S.C. § 552(b)(4). Exemption 4 protects trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person that is privileged or confidential.

Portions of the responsive records are exempt from disclosure under FOIA Exemption 6, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(6). Exemption 6 protects information that would constitute an unwarranted invasion of an individual's personal privacy. The types of information withheld under Exemption 6 include the names, addresses, or cell phone numbers of employees of Establishments and third parties, including, but not limited to interviewees or customers.

FSIS will continue to process records responsive to your request and will forward them promptly upon completion of review. As this is not a final response to your FOIA request, we request that you reserve your right to appeal. We will include your appeal rights in our final release.
