Dear Ms. O'Flaherty:

This is the final response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, dated April 1, 2021, to the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS). You requested a copy of all Noncompliance Records and Memoranda of Interview related to humane handling and slaughter for the months of January, February, and March of 2021. We received your request in our office on April 2, 2021.

The FSIS FOIA staff works with subject matter experts across the agency to locate responsive documents. For this request, we conducted a records search in the Office of Planning, Analysis, and Risk Management (OPARM). FSIS' search began on April 2, 2021. Our search includes responsive records in FSIS' control on that date.

We have located 166 pages that are responsive to your request. After a thorough review, we have determined that portions of these documents are exempt from disclosure under (b)(4) and (b)(6) of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552, as amended. Accordingly, this request is granted in part.

Exemption 4 of the FOIA protects "trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person [that is] privileged or confidential." 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(4). This exemption covers two distinct categories of information in federal agency records, (1) trade secrets, and (2) information that is (a) commercial or financial, and (b) obtained from a person, and (c) privileged or confidential. In this instance, the agency is withholding confidential commercial information such as specific business-related equipment. The information was submitted to USDA by a business. We have determined that these records contain commercial or financial information that is customarily treated as private by the business submitters. Therefore, the information is considered confidential.

Portions of the responsive records are exempt from disclosure under FOIA Exemption 6, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(6). Exemption 6 protects information that would constitute an unwarranted invasion of an individual's personal privacy. The types of information withheld under Exemption 6 include the names, addresses, or cell phone numbers of

employees of Establishments and third parties, including, but not limited to interviewees or customers

should include copies of your original request and this response, as well as reasons supporting your appeal. The envelope should be plainly marked to indicate that it contains a FOIA appeal. If you decide to appeal, please send your appeal to: You may appeal this determination no later than 90 days from the date of this letter. Your appeal


