NOTICE OF SUSPENSION HELD IN ABEYANCE

Dear Thor Eiriksson:

Voice 515.727.8960 Fax 515.727.8991 This letter confirms verbal notification provided by the Des Moines District Office, Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) to establishment M45856, HyLife Foods Windom, LLC, located at 2850 Highway 60 East, Windom, MN establishment herein referred to as the/your establishment, of the decision to place the Notice of Suspension (NOS) for an egregious humane handling event, initiated on January 16, 2023, into abeyance (NOSA).

On January 16, 2023, via multiple emails, you provided FSIS written corrective actions and preventive measures, in response to the regulatory noncompliance detailed in the NOS. The final response outlined actions adequate to address the noncompliance regarding humane handling of livestock requirements, including a plan to maintain compliance with the *Federal Meat Inspection Act* (FMIA) Title 21 of the United States Code (21 U.S.C. 603), the *Humane Methods of Slaughter Act* of 1978 (HMSA) (7 U.S.C. 1901 et seq.), and federal regulations {Title 9 of the Code of Federal Regulations (9 CFR) Part 313.15(a)(3)}.

The following documents were included, detailing actions immediately implemented and further proposed at your establishment:

- Establishment Training Document (8 Pages)
- Daily Yards Captive Bolt Log (1 Page)
- Revised Daily Yards Captive Bolt Log (4 Pages)
- Establishment Captive Bolt Stunner Training (9 Pages)
- Captive Bolt Stunning Training Log (2nd shift) (1 Page)
- Captive Bolt Stunning Training Log (1st shift) (1 Page)

Based on your written response, you were informed via telephone, that the suspension of the assignment of IPP, for slaughter operations, at your establishment is held in abeyance effective January 16, 2023.

The suspension will remain in abeyance pending verification by FSIS personnel that your proposed corrective actions and preventive measures have been effectively implemented and are adequate to maintain compliance. Establishment personnel should monitor operations to prevent violations of humane handling and slaughter from occurring in the future. It is also important for you to understand the responsibility of FSIS to initiate action when there is a failure to operate in accordance with 9 CFR Part 313 of the regulations.

During the abeyance period verification activities will be conducted by IPP and results will be reported to the Des Moines District Office on a weekly basis. The decision to hold the suspension action in abeyance is based on the proffered actions. Any modifications to your submitted corrective actions and preventive measures made during the abeyance period need to be submitted, in writing, to the Des Moines District Office for review prior to implementation by your establishment.

Please be advised that, as a federally inspected establishment, you are expected to comply with FSIS regulations and to take appropriate corrective action to prevent inhumane handling of livestock at your establishment. Your failure to comply with these requirements or to implement the measures in your action plan could result in reinstatement of the suspension of inspection at your establishment or other appropriate administrative or legal action.
