NOTICE OF SUSPENSION

Dear Mr. Robinson,

This serves as official notification by the Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) of the suspension of the assignment of inspection personnel related to your Slaughter process at Est. M46017 (ZMDR LLC DBA Republic Foods; Lone Jack, MO), as per Title 9 of the Code of Federal Regulations (9 CFR) 500.3(b) (Rules of Practice). This Notice of Suspension (NOS) is based on your failure to prevent inhumane handling and slaughter of livestock at your facility as required by 9 CFR 313.15(a)(1).

Background / Authority

In 7 U.S.C. 1901, the Humane Methods of Slaughter Act (Humane Slaughter Act) states: The Congress finds that the use of humane methods in the slaughter of livestock prevents needless suffering; results in safer and better working conditions for persons engaged in the slaughtering industry; brings about improvement of products and economies in slaughtering operations; and produces other benefits for producers, processors, and consumers which tend to expedite an orderly flow of livestock and livestock products in interstate and foreign commerce. It is therefore declared to be the policy of the United States that the slaughtering of livestock and the handling of livestock in connection with slaughter shall be carried out only by humane methods.

FSIS has developed Rules of Practice regarding enforcement (9 CFR Part 500) that describe the types of enforcement action that FSIS may take and include procedures for taking a withholding action and/or suspension, with or without prior notification, and for filing a complaint to withdraw a grant of federal inspection. As provided in 9 CFR 500.3(b), FSIS may impose a suspension without providing the establishment prior notification because the establishment is handling or slaughtering animals inhumanely.

In 21 U.S.C. 603(b), the Federal Meat Inspection Act (FMIA) states: For the purpose of preventing the inhumane slaughtering of livestock, the Secretary shall cause to be made, by inspectors appointed for that purpose, an examination and inspection of the method by which amenable species are slaughtered and handled in connection with slaughter in the slaughtering establishments inspected under this

chapter. The Secretary may refuse to provide inspection to a new slaughtering establishment or may cause inspection to be temporarily suspended at a slaughtering establishment if the Secretary finds that any cattle, sheep, swine, goats, horses, mules, or other equines have been slaughtered or handled in connection with slaughter at such establishment by any method not in accordance with the Act of August 27, 1958 (72 Stat. 862; 7 U.S.C. 1901–1906) until the establishment furnishes assurances satisfactory to the Secretary that all slaughtering and handling in connection with slaughter of livestock shall be in accordance with such a method.

Findings / Basis for Action

At approximately 6:32 p.m. on August 10, 2022, FSIS Inspection Program Personnel (IPP) observed a humane handling incident, as documented in Noncompliance Record (NR) SDY40100821111N/1. The NR states that IPP observed an animal lying on its side and kicking its front legs in the area designated for dead animals. Upon further examination, IPP observed a knock hole on the front of the head near the top of the forehead, animal vocalizing, and rhythmic motions of the chest indicative of breathing. The animal was repeatedly trying to right itself by attempting to lift its head and kicking its feet. IPP attempted to locate establishment management to stun the animal again, however, management personnel were no longer on the premises. Establishment management was contacted via phone by other establishment personnel. Then, IPP returned to the animal that continued to vocalize and attempted to right itself by lifting its head and kicking its feet. IPP again requested the establishment to stun the animal again. At approximately 6:50 p.m., a maintenance technician applied a poll knock which was immediately followed by pithing and sticking rendering the animal unconscious/dead. IPP took a regulatory control action by applying U.S. Reject Tag B45995553 to the knock box until the establishment could ensure stunning is effective at rendering animals immediately unconscious. The establishment determined, based on both verbal statements and video footage, that the animal was stunned at approximately 4:52 p.m. At approximately 7:00 PM, IPP informed (b) (6) that operations were suspended.

Your establishment failed to comply with 9 CFR 313.15(a)(1), the Humane Slaughter Act (Section 1902), and the Federal Meat Inspection Act (21 U.S.C. 603(b)). Based on the egregious nature of this incident, FSIS has determined that a suspension is warranted. IPP verbally notified you of this suspension on August 10, 2022, and this is written notification of the same.

Conclusion

In accordance with FSIS Rules of Practice, 9 CFR 500.3(b), we are formally notifying you of the suspension of the assignment of inspection personnel for the Slaughter process at your facility. The suspension will remain in effect until you provide adequate written corrective and preventive measures to assure that all livestock at your facility will be handled in a humane manner during slaughter. We will determine further action, if any, based upon your response. Your response should include:

1. Your description of the details of the incident.

- 2. An initial assessment of the incident and determination of the cause.
- 3. Immediate corrective actions taken.
- 4. Measures to prevent recurrence.
- 5. Any training of employees and materials used.
- 6. Type of monitoring activity for future humane handling of livestock, along with a documentation record.
