NOTICE OF SUSPENSION HELD IN ABEYANCE

Attention: Mr. Zimmerman,

This letter serves as official notification by the Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) of our decision to place the suspension action at **Hoffer's Ligonier Valley Packing, inc. (Est. M4025)**, located at 582 Darlington Road Ligonier, Pennsylvania 15658 in abeyance. This letter follows verbal notification of the abeyance action, provided by Mr. George Slobodjian, Deputy District Manager (DDM) to establishment management personnel, (b) (6) at approximately 1505 hours on Wednesday, May 17, 2023.

The decision to institute the abeyance was made in accordance with the Rules of Practice, Title 9 of the Code of Federal Regulations (9 CFR) Part 500.5 part (e).

In response to the Notice of Suspension (NOS), you submitted proposed corrective actions and preventative measures on May 17, 2023. On May 17, 2023, FSIS requested clarification to those responses. On May 17, 2023 you submitted responses to the clarification request(s) which included corrective actions and program updates.

Your corrective and preventative measures include but are not limited to:

- 1. Provided a copy of the "HLVP Robust Handling plan" with updates that state:
 - a. 1 market hog will be brought to the stun box at a time to allow for proper head and chest stunning as well as timely shackling and bleeding of the market hog.
 - b. For swine, the captive bolt will be the secondary backup in case of electric stunner malfunction. The backup captive bolt shall be in a watertight box around the half wall by stun box (directly next to location of primary captive bolt (between stuns) and ammunition). This area is essentially located at the rear of stun

box with a block pillar separating the stun box from location of captive bolt guns. 6-8 feet from head of stun box.

- c. Roaster swine, under 100 pounds, classify as small animals and can still have more than one (roaster swine) in the stunning box.
- d. Unconsciousness: The stunner or bleeder shall check for unconsciousness on every stunned animal. Captive bolt stunned animals shall be checked for immediate fall to ground, corneal reflex, independent blinking, vocalization, and any attempt to right itself. Electrically stunned animals shall be checked for an immediate fall to ground following the electrical stun, no eye tracking or corneal response, the head is limp, no response to stimuli (touching on the sides), the animal, while potentially kicking, will not attempt to stand or have any coordinated movements. If there are signs of Returning to Consciousness, Immediate Corrective Action shall be taken, and the animal shall be given a Security Stun.
- 2. Only employees trained in stunning shall operate stunning equipment AND hoist control during electric stunning.
- 3. All swine will be head and chest stunned with the electrical stunning device.
- 4. Establishment will institute two (2) separate training logs, on an annual basis, one (1) [training] will be for all employees who work the slaughter floor, which will be general humane handling procedures for moving animals through pens and in alley ways. The second will be for stunning personnel which at this time will include (b) (6) (6) . Mark Zimmerman, and (b) (6) . Additional employees may be added to this list at another time. These are the only three (3) employees who have training and plant permission to stun and therefore to operate bleed hoist during electric stunning. The reason for hoist control being limited to the above 3 employees during electric stunning is due to the specific monitoring that must be performed while electrically stunning. Therefore, if the stunner feels a security stun is required, he shall maintain control of the hoist from the time the animal is first stunned until the animal is bled.

FSIS has carefully reviewed your responses and made the decision to place the NOS in abeyance. FSIS has designed a Verification Plan (VP), and Inspection Program Personnel (IPP) will use it to monitor and verify that you have effectively implemented your proposed actions. The VP identifies your corrective actions based on your responses, the relevant regulatory requirements, the tasks IPP will use to conduct verification activities, and the times that you identified. IPP will continue to ensure all humane handling/stunning regulatory requirements of 9 CFR Part 313 are in regulatory compliance. We have attached a copy of the VP to assist you as a reference during the Agency's verification activities.

A final decision relative to this enforcement action will be determined based on your establishment's ability to execute and comply with your proffered corrective actions and all applicable regulatory requirements. Your establishment's failure to meet the

conditions of this abeyance may result in additional regulatory and/or administrative actions in accordance with the Rules of Practice 9 CFR Part 500.
