**Thailand - Plants Eligible to Export Meat (Siluriformes Only) to the United States**

April 19, 2018

**Updated items marked with an asterisk (\*)**

*In accordance with the FSIS rule published on December 2, 2015 (80 FR, 75590), Thailand has submitted documentation to FSIS showing that they have laws or other legal measures in place that provide authority to regulate the growing and processing of Siluriformes fish for human food, and that will ensure compliance with the Food and Drug Administration's regulatory requirements in 21 CFR part 123, Fish and Fishery Products. In addition, the country has put forward the following establishments as eligible to export Siluriformes fish and fish products to the United States. FSIS will update the list of establishments as new information is received.*

*By the end of the 18-month transitional period, September 1, 2017, foreign countries seeking to continue exporting such product to the United States had to submit adequate documentation showing the equivalence of their Siluriformes inspection systems with that of the United States.*
