<p>II.1.1 the meat comes from (an) establishment(s) implementing a programme based on the HACCP principles in accordance with Regulation (EC) No 852/2004;</p>			
<p>II.1.2 the meat has been obtained in accordance with Section IV of Annex III to Regulation (EC) No 853/2004, an in particular:</p>

<p>Notes</p> <p>This certificate is meant for fresh meat, excluding offal and minced meat, of wild animals belonging to the Suidae, Tayassuidae, or Tapiridae families that are killed or hunted in the wild.</p> <p>Fresh meat means all animal parts fit for human consumption whether fresh, chilled or frozen.</p> <p>After importation, unskinned carcasses must be conveyed without delay to the processing establishment of destination.</p>
