

Guidelines for Health Certificate for animal by-products to be used for purposes outside the feed chain or for trade samples, intended for dispatch to or for transit through the European Union

Part I. Details of Dispatched Consignment

- I.1 Enter full name, address, and telephone number of entity in the US exporting the product
- I.2 Enter serial number from FSIS Form 9060-5
 - I.2.a Leave Blank
- I.3 Enter “FSIS”
- I.4 Enter FSIS District Office
- I.5 Enter full name, address, and telephone number of entity receiving the product in the EU
- I.6 Leave Blank
- I.7 If U.S., enter “US” and “US-0”. If from another country, enter [appropriate code](#).
- I.8 Mark through
- I.9 Enter destination of EU country name and ISO code
[Austria **AT**; Belgium **BE**; Bulgaria **BG**; Croatia **HR**; Cyprus **CY**; Czech Republic **CZ**; Denmark **DK**; Estonia **EE**; Finland **FI**; France **FR**; Germany **DE**; Greece **GR**; Hungary **HU**; Ireland **IE**; Italy **IT**; Latvia **LV**; Lithuania **LT**; Luxembourg **LU**; Malta **MT**; Netherlands **NL**; Poland **PL**; Portugal **PT**; Romania **RO**; Slovakia **SK**, Slovenia **SL**, Spain **ES**; Sweden **SE**; and the United Kingdom/Northern Ireland **GB**]
- I.10 Leave Blank
- I.11 Enter Establishment name, address, and Est. No. of the last establishment where the container is packed.
- I.12 Leave Blank
- I.13 Enter place of loading
- I.14 Enter date of shipment departure – should not precede the date in the signature block of the certificate unless this certificate is a replacement certificate for product that has already shipped under a prior certificate.
- I.15 Complete as appropriate: Mark through “Railway wagon,” “Road vehicle” and “Other.” Indicate “Aeroplane” or “Ship” as appropriate, and provide ship name or airline flight number/s
- I.16 Enter Border Inspection Post (BIP) in the EU, point of first arrival
- I.17 Enter “NA”

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- I.18 Indicate animal species and description of product as labeled
- I.19 Use the appropriate HS code: 02.01, 02.02, 02.06, or 15.02.
(Appropriate HS codes can be found in the footnotes to Box I.19 on the letterhead certificate)
- I.20 Indicate total gross weight and total net weight
- I.21 Check appropriate box.
- I.22 Enter No. of pieces or packages
- I.23 Enter container and seal number, if applicable
- I.24 Enter type of container e.g. cans, cardboard, plastic, etc
- I.25 Check box “Technical use ”
- I.26 Leave Blank
- I.27 Place a checkmark
- I.28 Enter information as appropriate
 - Species: enter bovine, ovine, caprine, domestic equine, domestic porcine, etc.
 - Nature of commodity: complete as appropriate
 - Approval number of establishments manufacturing plant : Enter establishment number of manufacturer
 - Number of packages: enter total number of packages
 - Net weight: enter total net weight in metric units
 - Batch number: enter lot number as appropriate

II.a Certificate No. from I.2

II.b Mark through

II.2.1(a) If product is from another country, enter [appropriate code](#).

II.2.1(b) If product is from US, If U.S., “US-0”.

Signature Block: Official veterinarian/Official Inspector

Name (in capital letters): enter name of PHV in capital letters

Qualification and title: enter the PHV’s qualification (Doctorate of veterinary medicine) and title (Public health

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veterinarian)

Date - should match the issue date of FSIS Form 9060-5

Signature- the PHV's ink signature in a color other than black

Stamp- Apply the rubber USDA export stamp in a color other than black. The certificate number shown on the stamp is the certificate number of the certificate.

The PHV is also to sign the signature line at the bottom of each page.
